

Day 1 – October 7 Thursday – Depart USA

Day 2 – October 8 Friday – Arrive Fukuoka

Transfer by taxi from Fukuoka Airport. Our centrally located hotel provides easy access to canal-crossed **Fukuoka**, Japan's eighth biggest city and the largest on the island of Kyushu and in western Japan. Our hotel's amenities include a fitness center and spa and a location in Canal City, Fukuoka's leading shopping and entertainment center. You will have time to explore on your own using suggestions provided by Esprit; hotel concierges can also assist.

Day 3 – October 9 Saturday – Fukuoka

We begin the day with some traditional sites of Fukuoka including the **Kishida Shinto Shrine** (city shrine and home base of one of Japan's great parade festivals) and the nearby **Hakata Machiya Furusato-kan Museum**, celebrating life in the city's historic merchant homes, followed by presentations about local crafts including prized, multi-layered *Hakata-ori* weaving. Lunch today is a **cooking class of local specialties**, with the afternoon and evening free for individual exploration in the city's parks, museums such as the acclaimed Asian Art Museum, design and craft shops and restaurants from casual to refined.

Day 4 – October 10 Sunday – Fukuoka (Mojiko Day Trip)

Today we will spend the day in **Mojiko**, a beautifully preserved port town with many **buildings of the Taisho era** (1912-1926), delightful for strolling, Lunch will be **yaki-curry (baked curry rice)**, a local take on this popular Japanese comfort food, at one of Japan's growing community of **microbreweries**. We return to Fukuoka for dinner of the city's most famous dish, **Hakata-style tonkotsu ramen** in hearty, pork-based broth, followed by a visit to a bar highlighting the latest of Japan's **cutting-edge cocktail culture**.

Day 5 – October 11 Monday – Fukuoka (Yobuko and Karatsu Day Trip)

Today we will head west to neighboring **Saga Prefecture**. A lovely drive along Karatsu Bay takes us to the intimate **fishing village** of **Yobuko**, famed for its **morning market** where local people sell their catch and produce and make homemade *furikake* (flavored sprinkles for rice). From Yobuko, it is a drive of about 30 minutes to **Karatsu**, one of the prefecture's famous



pottery towns. Today's lunch will be catered by a nationally renowned **tofu shop**, followed by visits to a **pottery studio** and the meticulously crafted **hikiyama floats** used in the city's main festival. We return to Fukuoka in the afternoon and have dinner in true local style at **yatai** (open-air food stalls) lining the city's many waterways. Fukuoka has over 150 *yatai*, more than the rest of Japan combined!

Day 6 – October 12 Tuesday – Fukuoka to Nagasaki via Dazaifu

Today we will depart by bus with our luggage. Our first stop is lively **Dazaifu**, early capital of Kyushu and beautifully nestled in the woods. Here we will stroll the sprawling, photogenic grounds of the **Tenman Shrine**, 1,100 years old and dedicated to the Shinto god of scholarship, and visit the futuristic **Kyushu National Museum**, whose priceless collection chronicles the region's history of trade with the Asian continent. Following lunch on your own at one of many casual



restaurants, we will learn to make Dazaifu's local specialty sweet, **umegae mochi**, bean-paste dumplings embossed with plum blossom designs. In the late afternoon we will arrive in Nagasaki, known for centuries of fusion of eastern and western cultures. Tonight, we will enjoy a casual dinner by the harbor.

Day 7 – October 13 Wednesday – Nagasaki

Our exploration of Nagasaki begins at the **Museum of History and Culture**, covering the city's one-of-a-kind history that inspired tales from *Madame Butterfly* to the *1,000 Autumns of Jacob de Zoet*. We then tour **Dejima**, the man-made island that served as an Edo-Period Dutch trading post and Japan's sole point of contact with the outside world for over two centuries, now filled with faithfully reconstructed period buildings. This will be followed by a **lesson in Nagasaki-style cuisine**, and we will eat our creations for lunch. In the afternoon, we will visit **Glover Garden** to view its collection of **Meiji Period architecture** and expansive **views across Nagasaki Bay**. Fittingly, tonight's dinner is **shippoku-ryori**, Nagasaki's own east-meets-west version of *kaiseki* cuisine.

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Day 8 – October 14 Thursday – Nagasaki

Today we will concentrate on the **atomic bombing sites** on Nagasaki's north side, learn how this site came to be chosen for the bombing at the last minute, visit the museum and sites of the destruction and meet with a *hibakusha* (survivor) to hear his story. After **lunch of local specialties**, we will visit **Suwa-jinja**, the city's most storied Shinto shrine, where we will receive a blessing through **kagura**, ritual dance accompanied by ancient music and chanting. While the rest of the day is at leisure, you may wish to join your tour leader for a **cable car ride up Mt. Inasa**. The spectacular nighttime views across the city and bay have been rated among the top three in the world, alongside Hong Kong and Monaco.

Day 9 – October 15 Friday – Nagasaki (Shimabara Peninsula Day Trip)

Today we will visit the **Shimabara Peninsula**, southeast of Nagasaki, known for its landscape of mountains, splendid views of the Ariake Sea, and hot springs. Our visits include Japan's longest **hot-spring foot bath**, lunch where we will choose our own **ingredients steamed over natural hot springs**, and an optional **short hike in Unzen National Park**, among the steam vents called *jigoku* ('hells' in Japanese), which have a stark beauty and a unique role in the region's history. Back in Nagasaki, a **banquet dinner in Chinatown** pays tribute to the city's Chinese history.

Day 10 – October 16 Saturday – Nagasaki to Miyajima

Today we will ship our large suitcases to onward destinations in order to travel with carry-on luggage. You will have the opportunity to purchase the train-station *bento* lunch of your choice to enjoy en route. Express, *Shinkansen* (bullet) and local trains speed us to **Hiroshima Prefecture**, home of the island of **Miyajima** and the famous **Itsukushima Shrine**, whose recently restored *torii* gate seems to float on the water. We will have time to explore the island before heading back to the mainland and our luxurious **ryokan** for the night. Our inn, Sekitei, has a mid-20th century Japonesque style, views across the strait, lovely **onsen baths** and elaborate, multi-course **kaiseki dinners** incorporating local specialties including *anago* (saltwater eel).

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Day 11 - October 17 Sunday - Hiroshima

Following a sumptuous **Japanese-style breakfast** in our inn, we will journey to Hiroshima to spend the day in and around **Hiroshima's Peace Park**, featuring many moving memorials and the recently renovated and expanded **Peace Memorial Museum**. This evening's farewell dinner will feature local Hiroshima specialties.

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Benesse Art Site Extension

Day 12 – October 18 Monday – Hiroshima to Teshima and Naoshima Islands

After breakfast, we will journey by *Shinkansen*, coach and ferry to Japan's premier destination for contemporary art, **Benesse Art Site**. We begin on rural **Teshima Island** to experience the **Teshima Yokoo House** and **Teshima Art Museum** and enjoy a quiet lunch at a local restaurant. In mid-afternoon, we arrive on neighboring **Naoshima Island** in the Inland Sea and will have time to explore the outdoor sculpture park around our lodgings, **Benesse House Park Hotel**. This **Tadao Ando-designed hotel** houses numerous art pieces and is located right along the island's edge. Each room has its own installed art for you to enjoy while you are in residence. Dinner this evening will be at the hotel's **Terrace Restaurant**, a fusion of French cuisine using local ingredients.

Day 13 – October 19 Tuesday – Naoshima Island

Following breakfast at our inn, this morning we'll explore some of Naoshima's installations and museums, including the **Chichu Museum** and the **Lee Ufan Museum**. After lunch at a local restaurant, we will spend the afternoon exploring the **Art House Project**, in which older homes and businesses have been turned into installations by leading artists. Our **farewell dinner** will be at **Issen Restaurant** at the **Benesse House Museum**, offering a contemporary interpretation of *kaiseki* served on an array of artistic functional ware from kilns all over Japan. After dinner, we will have the opportunity to take in the Benesse House Museum after hours.
